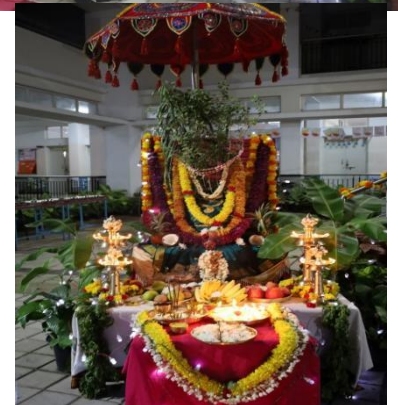


Karthika Deepotsava, Utthana Dwadashi, and Tulasi Pooje

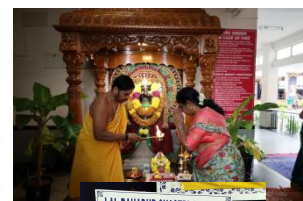
The celebration concluded with a serene Deeparati performed by dignitaries, staff, and parents, followed by the distribution of Prasadam.

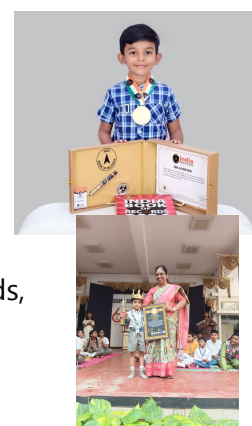
